## **World Series bet produces steak dinner for homeless veterans**



BOSTON -- The traditional World Series bet between senators from Massachusetts and Colorado produces a steak dinner at the New England Shelter for Homeless Veterans in Boston.

Senators Edward Kennedy and John Kerry challenged Colorado Senators Wayne Allard and Ken Salazar that the Red Sox would defeat the Colorado Rockies in the World Series.

Kennedy and Kerry wagered New England clam chowder and lobster rolls while their Colorado colleagues countered with 100 pounds of Colorado-raised beef.

The Red Sox won in a four-game sweep, forcing the Colorado senators to donate the grub to a charity chosen by the Massachusetts senators.

Two restaurants in Acton and Boston prepared the steak dinner and provided the side dishes to accompany the meal.
